OneLife Africa Student Campus-Nakuru, Kenya

North of the city of Nakuru, Kenya OneLife Africa has completed a residential student campus that hosts quarterly high school holiday camps reaching up to 1,000 high school students each year beginning 2022. Additionally, this campus is used to host high school graduates for a nine-month Leadership, Evangelism, and Discipleship (LEAD) program. LEAD is a 9-month residential program designed for high school graduates who seek to grow in their love and knowledge of Jesus Christ, discern God's call in their lives, train them to engage in Gods mission for the world and equip them with practical Life skills as they prepare for life at College/University and beyond.



LEAD Program

OneLife Africa Leadership, Evangelism and Discipleship Program (LEAD) is a Nine months program for the high school graduates, the program creates a healing communal environment that encourages students to live together in community, learn from a dedicated team of mentors and lead in Jesus' name! Students are equipped to Grow with God's people, Go into God's world and Give for God's glory. The Program comprises of several courses that the students learn across the three months residential phase of the program, these courses includes, Biblical Life Management, The Book of Romans, Personal Evangelism, Research Skills, Critical Thinking, Public Speaking and Computer Studies. These courses are spread across the week and most of them are taught on a daily basis, below is description of a day in life of OneLife Africa LEAD Program student.

I am Allan Litali. I am of Kenyan citizenship coming from the Western part of the country. I first heard of OneLife Africa back in 2011 through a fellow scholar by the name Josephine Chaba. The year 2011 was the year I was completing my primary school in Tiba Academy, Josephine had already completed the same level the previous year and was now in Form 1 (tenth grade) at Pangani Girls High School supported by OneLife Africa. At this moment in time, I was not sure what the future held in matters of education because even though I was a top student in the school located in the Baba Dogo a marginalized community in Nairobi, and because of financial constraints back at home, going to the next level of education that required finances was seemingly a daytime dream. Nevertheless, I kept the faith and hope that the Lord has a perfect plan for me regardless of the situation at home. I sat my primary school examinations and topped my school with 384 out of the possible 500 marks. I received these results while in the village in Kakamega County. Josephine, a heaven-sent friend, still did not tire from looking out for me. Being in the village, I

was not even in a good position to write an application letter to OneLife Africa because of the distance and resources. Josephine helped in submitting an application for me. When I came back to Nairobi, I was invited for the OneLife Africa interview which attracted hundreds of students seeking to be considered for the 25 high school sponsorship slots, by God's grace I was among the chosen students to join OneLife Africa Scholarship and Mentoring Program in 2012. I joined St Patrick's High School-Iten which is a National School. I studied without the fear of being sent home for school fees because One-Life Africa was taking care of my school fees. Kenya Shillings 70,000 was not a cost my parents would afford at that time, but OneLife Africa took care of every cent. I was in St. Patrick's between 2012 and 2015. During this time, I maintained my status as a top student determined to use the education opportunity to change the situation back home. Being a young believer, OneLife Africa Mentorship during the school holidays helped a big deal in increasing my knowledge in Christian faith and shaping my character. By this, OneLife Africa has put into the society holistic human beings, intelligent people, people of impeccable character as well as God fearing individuals. During the holidays all scholars would attend organized youth camps. We would spend a whole week studying the bible, exploring our God given gifts and interacting with counselors and our peers. Through these camps my gift in the Worship Music ministry was brought to light in a big way. Till this day I lead worship in my church as a result of the mentorship I got at the youth camp. In 2015 I completed my High School education and joined Kenyatta University in September 2016 to pursue a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering which I completed and graduated in 2022. Looking back in my life, I believe that God is in control. I had a beautiful wedding back in June and now I'm a family man. Through the knowledge I have accumulated through school, I now work as Virtual Assistant online to earn a living. The Lord is good to me. OneLife Africa has played a major part in raising a young boy to the man I'm today, I thank all the partners and sponsors of OneLife Africa, I'm grateful. Presently I am working at the Kenya Water Institute as an intern in the Short Courses and Curriculum Development Department under the Research, Consultancy and Technical Services Division. The placement is through the Kenya Public Service Commission Internship Programme which is a year-long programme run by the Kenya National Government though the Public Service Commission. I am managing the National Non-Renewable Water (NRW) Centre of Excellence based at the Institute. The centre is responsible for management of Non-Renewable water losses within the water sector. The losses are currently what different utilities across the country are putting efforts to address. As part of the management, I also help with the demonstration of the various Non-Renewable Water equipment, ultrasonic flow metres, leak noise detectors and listening sticks, that are at the centre. Additionally, I also support the running and administration of short courses. This entails planning, implementing and maintaining of the different short course programs that are either hosted at the Nairobi Campus or even the other Kenya Water Institute (KEWI) campuses, serving as the first point of contact for program prospective students, communicating clearly and concisely, maintaining accurate records of the professional development programs and assisting with developing program evaluation tools and techniques. Moreover, I am a contributor to the weekly Kenya Water Institute

newsletter in which I have written on topical areas within the Kenya water sector ranging from water quality, non-revenue water loss management and even the role of public speaking in the water sector. Besides the work I do at the Kenya Water Institute, I also volunteer my time with youth organizations that offer mentorship and training in debate and public speaking for young people. I manage day-to-day operations and ensure efficiency and productivity, providing effective leadership by listening, offering solutions, and demonstrating flexibility and analyse internal operations and identify areas for improvement. I have been honored to lead a delegation of adjudicators to Tanzania for the Annual Tanzania National Debate Championships and the East Africa Schools Debate Championships whose finals are held at the African Court for People and Human Rights and the East Africa Legislative Assembly respectively. OneLife Africa offered me the foundation to achieve all the above through mentorship during high school and even beyond it offered various leadership opportunities to serve during the various camps as a facilitator and even group leader for the various groups. I have had the opportunity to join the various National Prayer Breakfast sessions both in Kenya and Uganda that further helped grow my zeal for leadership transformation by interacting with leaders from across the political, religious and business divide and drawing inspiration from their leadership journey. I remain grateful for all the support and mentorship that I have received from OneLife Africa and the US short term team members who over the years have modeled servant leadership for me.
